ACE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Our ACE Program is targeted towards high achieving Year 9 students who are interested in accelerating 2 VCE subjects in Year 10, allowing them to access greater subject selections, leading to a high ATAR in Year 12, opening more opportunities for university pathways.

The ACE Program will allow students to study 2 Year 11 subjects as a Year 10 student, rather than the 1 subject that is normally allowed. Our ACE cohort also have a wider breadth of subject choices available to them, including Biology and Maths Methods, which are normally reserved for VCE students only. In having access to a wider range of subject options, students are presented with the opportunity to study a wider breadth of subjects, exploring pathways that they may not have considered previously.

The ACE cohort is provided additional support through their years at Point Cook Senior Secondary College, with a wide range of academic support, as well as wellbeing and social supports put in place to ensure their success throughout their senior secondary years. Students are also provided a range of opportunities in extra-curricular activities, such as in student leadership and work experience.

The program aims to increase the ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank) of the students, giving them access to a wider range of options when applying for university courses.

BENEFITS OF THE ACE PROGRAM

The ACE Program offers significant academic advantages by allowing high-achieving students to accelerate their learning journey. By studying two Year 11 subjects in Year 10, students can develop advanced academic skills earlier and gain valuable experience with VCE-level coursework before their peers. The program's expanded subject choices, including access to Biology and Maths Methods, enables students to explore academic disciplines they might not otherwise have considered. This early exposure to a wider range of subjects helps students discover new interests and potential career pathways, allowing them to make more informed decisions about their academic specialisation.



The comprehensive support system embedded within the ACE Program ensures students thrive while exploring these new academic territories. Through dedicated academic support services, students receive targeted assistance as they venture into unfamiliar subjects and develop sophisticated study techniques. The program's emphasis on wellbeing and social support helps students maintain confidence as they challenge themselves with new academic disciplines. Under the ACE Program, our students have the opportunity to study up to 7 Year 12 subjects by the end of their VCE, thus allowing a wider breadth of subjects studied, and the opportunity for a higher ATAR achieved.

Students may be able to study 4 subjects in Year 12 instead of 5, allowing them to have a private study block to focus on their subjects. This is subject to the Principal's discretion and will be decided on once students are in Year 12.

ACE & ADVISORY

At Point Cook Senior Secondary College, we understand that academic excellence must be supported by strong personal development and wellbeing practices. Our ACE & Advisory program is specifically designed to provide our high-achieving students with the tools, support, and guidance they need to thrive both academically and personally.

Meeting weekly with their dedicated Advisory teacher, ACE students participate in targeted sessions that focus on developing crucial life skills and fostering a strong sense of community. Through our carefully structured program, students engage in activities and discussions that strengthen their identity as learners and future leaders.

Program Focus Areas

Our Advisory sessions are built around key developmental areas that support student success. Students explore and develop their personal identity, understanding their strengths, values, and learning styles. Through focused habit-forming activities, they learn to establish and maintain productive routines that support their accelerated academic program.

The buddy system pairs students with peers, creating a supportive network that enhances learning and social connections. This system, combined with our school connectedness initiatives, helps students build strong relationships within their cohort and the broader school community.

Career development is a significant focus, with students receiving specialised guidance in career planning and valuable work experience opportunities. Our career tools sessions help students explore potential pathways and understand the connection between their current studies and future aspirations.

Understanding the importance of emotional wellbeing, our program includes sessions on emotional regulation and stress management. Students learn practical strategies to maintain balance while pursuing academic excellence. APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications Open - Monday 28th April 2025

Families will be able to pick up an application pack from our front office.

Applications Close - Monday 2nd June 2025

Applications should be submitted back to our front office by 4pm. We will not be able to accept any applications after the closing date.

Interviews begin - Monday June 16 2025

Families will be contacted via email with the day and time for their child to be interviewed.

ACE Entry Test - Saturday 21st June 2025

The school will be utilising the ACER Higher Ability Selection Test (HAST) to determine suitability for the program.

Offers made - from Monday August 4 2025

Applicants will be contacted via email. Successful applicants wishing to undertake Maths Methods will be asked to sit an additional test administered by the school's Maths team to determine suitability.
